Autumn One	Hazards	To ease pupils into the increased demands of A level, Year 12 begins with the familiar topic of hazards. Pupils build on the foundational knowledge developed in Key Stage 4 to grow a deeper understanding of the nature, causes, impacts and responses to storm hazards. This then forms the foundation, from which they explore a novel hazard: wildfires. Finally, pupils explore a multi-hazard environment and consider the underlying physical and human causes of the hazards, their interrelationships and the extent to which human populations are prepared for and resilient to the hazards they face.

Spring One	Glacial systems and landscapes	Pupils take a systems based approach to exploring glacial landscapes and are encouraged to consider the interrelationships between the glacial system and the water and carbon systems being studied concurrently with teacher A. Pupils build on their foundational knowledge of physical landscape formation gleaned from Rivers and Coasts in Key Stages 3 and 4 to explore the formation of a range of glacial landscapes. Particular emphasis is placed on landscape development i.e. how a variety of factors and processes influence landscape change over time. Pupils are also asked to consider the extent of the challenges, opportunities faced by people living in cold environments and the effectiveness of attempts to manage them.
