	Unit	Details
Spring Two	Extreme Earth/Weather	In this unit the Year 6 pupils will investigate the worlds' climate zones and explore some of the causes of extreme weather events and the impact these can have on society. Developing their understanding of being a "global citizen", they will discover ways in which people are trying to minimise/reduce future extreme weather events and how we can have a positive impact on the environment.
Summer One	Mapping our coast	Building on their knowledge of the local area from Key Stage One, the pupils will develop their map skills and will use these skills to map and label the features found along our coastline. They will explore how different physical features have formed and why some human features have been located in certain areas.
Summer Two	Our coastal links	This unit will begin by exploring the different types of land use in the UK and will then focus on our local area - investigating economic activity, including trade links and the distribution of natural resources. Pupils will investigate the ambition for land use in our local area and will carry out field work to further develop their map skills.

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Geography is taught on a carousel with History, which is taught during the other half terms.
